#### **Finances**

#### Financial report

### Flooring project videos:

Steve has completed the first of the flooring project videos featuring hollowcore flooring – Bunnings Factory in Melbourne (Hollowcore Concrete).

Steve is also planning to film another hollowcore flooring project - Curtin University project in Perth (Delta Corp). Another possible hollowcore flooring project has also been flagged Porsche dealership project in Melbourne (Hollow Core Concrete), however other members' projects first need to be covered.

# Steve has commenced producing a general project - Nan Tien Institute in Wollongong NSW (being funded by SA Precast).

*Note* - Regardless of type of video, members are asked to please try to retain arrangements that are made for filming (including interviewees), noting that last minute changes incur unnecessary cost.

#### DesignBUILD Exhibition (Sydney 28-30 April)

The NP DesignBUILD stand is 12m x 6m, part of which will be a café. The NP stand will consist of 2 printed backing walls 3m wide x 2.4m high, 3 column signs 400mm x 400mm x 2.4m high (printed with Precast Walling, Precast Flooring and Precast Furniture), 1 square hanging sign and 3 square timber plinths 600mm x 600mm x 100/200/300mm high. All elements will allow reuse, in whole or part, at future exhibitions.

Samples of each type of product, walling, flooring and furniture, will be placed around the 3 column signs. Walling samples will be displayed as 3 open top/bottom cubes (400x400x400, 500x500x500, 600x600x600), being manufactured in GRC to display 12 walling finishes (4 per cube). A heavy duty clear perspex lid will be placed on top of each cube to allow viewing of internal connections.

Flooring samples (hollowcore, Ultrafloor and transfloor) will be placed on the 3 MDF plinths. Samples will be sought from members for display (each sample to be max 600mm long). Members should contact Peter Webb if interested in providing a sample.

Quatro Design will supply GRC furniture. Concrete by Design will supply a counter.

Peter Webb will assist to co-ordinate samples.

Members who have contributed to manufacturing samples, will be able to send one person to man the stand for the 3 day duration. Other members who have not contributed to manufacturing and wish to man the stand will be asked to contribute in another way (eg assist with transportation costs or other sundry stand costs). That way, all who reap a benefit from participating, will have contributed something.

Cathy Inglis from Austral will be doing a project presentation as part of the seminar programme.

#### Stakeholder association relationships

Key members of ACIF have initiated a strategic planning day, being held on 5<sup>th</sup> March. If the ACIF membership fee is significantly reduced, National Precast would reconsider membership. ASBEC or BPIC are still options, should a change not eventuate with ACIF.

#### **Education**

#### Introduction to Precast for Structural Engineers – e-learning/video, face to face/webinar, CPD

The Design Guide had been tasked with identifying 10 possible webinar titles, derived from material contained in both the Precast Concrete Handbook and the Design Guide. There has been no progress with this.

Discussions however, are being held with CIA regarding a possible collaboration in the precast education space. For many years CIA and NP have doubled up and/or competed in educating engineers about precast and possible win-win outcomes are being investigated. It is likely that a jointly presented precast seminar will be trialled on the Thursday following Concrete 2015.

#### AS3850 webinar

Finalisation of the date for this webinar are still pending publishing of the revised Standard.

# 4. PUBLICATIONS

#### Publication sales

Sales figures have been included in the monthly financial reports.

NP initiated a teleconference with SAI Global's Publishing Director regarding SAI promotion of our publications and SAI have now prepared a promotional schedule for 2015 and improve consultation with NP regarding content. Discussions are also now being held with SAI's Head of Marketing to address the drop in publication sales (we are not the only association experiencing this) which has come about because of changes in how SAI promotes publications. No additional members have ordered discounted copies of the Student edition of the Precast Handbook CD, since being promoted... however may still do so.

#### Design Guide for Precast

The Design Guide committee met with Barry Crisp in Sydney prior to the November Members' Meeting to discuss/finalise all text changes in the Guide. Mark from Strusoft was briefed at the same time and has prepared drawings for Chapter 7 that have been distributed to the committee for their review.

#### Stressing Best Practice

A call to members for information on stressing practices/procedures resulted in only one response - from Ultrafloor. Glenn Degenhardt (who has offered to lead this project) has also been provided with a British Precast document, which could be used as an initial template for an industry best practice. A discussion will be held at the Members' Meeting on the importance/priority/process for this task.

# 5. REPRESENTATION/ADVOCACY

## <u>ACRS</u>

### National Precast representative Bob Connell ITW

Further to his November report, Bob advises that there is a belief that builders, engineers, developers and owners will increasingly demand proof of compliance. ACRS certification fills this need and therefore should drive more companies to join the ACRS scheme. ACRS will increase its promotional activity, positioning itself as the premier proof of compliance scheme... the only one which is supported by ongoing auditing of continued product compliance. There is also a serious push from roads' boards and some large builders/developers, to ensure that precasters who have installed reo processing equipment - such as mesh machines, stirrup benders and straightening/bending equipment - are ACRS certified (as are the reo processing companies). This drive is to ensure that the raw materials are compliant and the processing is controlled/output tested in accordance with standards' requirements. At this stage there does not seem to be any push to require certification/testing by precasters who are bending and shaping reo bar which is supplied in straight lengths by ACRS-certified suppliers.

All NP Precaster members should consider the impact of Bob Connell's advice.

#### WHS Authorities

# Safe Work Australia: National Code of Practice for Precast, Tilt-up and Concrete Elements in Building Construction

No change to the August report that SWA's intention is still to wait until the revised AS3850 is released before revision of the Code is considered.

All members are asked to provide input to Peter Webb on an industry agreed revised appendix for new Code.

#### SA Safeguard

Sarah attended a meeting of the South Australian Construction Safety Alliance (SACSA), which finalised the amended safeguard, for circulation to all SA precast manufacturers and transport companies.

### **Roads Authorities**

#### TMR

The following Notice to Precasters has been issued since our November meeting:

• 2015/1 Accelerated Curing

A further draft of MRTS70 Concrete has been developed for heat accelerated curing.

It was decided, after consultation with NP members, that we would use this Notice, which provided 14 working days to provide an industry response, to illustrate to TMR the folly of their approach to industry consultation. After representation by NP an extension of 22 working days over their original timetable was agreed. The Civil Group will sign-off on an NP response to TMR on accelerated curing at the February meeting.

#### Austroads Proposed National Prequalification System for Precast Concrete Products

All NP members were asked in December to provide comment on this proposal. Only three replies were received and it was decided that the Civil Group would undertake the preparation of the NP response. The Group will finalise its response at the February meeting.

#### Roads Australia Geopolymer forum

Sarah attended the Roads Australia Geopolymer Forum in late November, addressing research on and the use of geopolymer concrete. A link to the presentations has been circulated to all members.

#### BCA Proposal for Change (PFC) – Mass Enhanced R-value & R-value Calculators

Sarah met with Terry Williamson to undertake the re-drafting of the Industry Standard to include brick and block. Peter Webb has re-drafted the PFC with the proposed BCA 2016 wording and distributed for our internal review. The PFC and Industry Standard are to be finalised and submitted to the ABCB by early March.

#### Standards Australia – various Standards

### New SA Committee Member Deed

SA has issued to all committee members, a revised Committee member Deed, along with an invitation to attend a SA workshop, being held around the country in February and March. Nominating organisations have also been invited to participate in a teleconference. Peter Webb will participate in the March teleconference on NP's behalf, and has been asked to address the need for committee members to be able to communicate committee-in-confidence matters with their nominating organisations, to ensure effective representation.

#### **BD-02** Committee AS3600 Concrete Structures Hanson Precast National Precast representative Nagesh Kanapathy Nagesh advises that the commentary, AS3600-2009 Supp 1:2014, was published in early December 2014 and is available on the Standards hub. As previously advised, planning for the next AS3600 revision will now follow, with the committee developing a revision proposal the next round of Prioritisation (2 February 2015 to 18 March 2015). Standards is yet to advise the committee of the anticipated meeting/workload for 2015. Nagesh will continue to monitor committee communication. **BD-032** Committee AS2327 Composite Structures National Precast representative Kevin Huff Ultrafloor Kevin advises the review process is still underway, with the current committee focusing on fire and preparing the Standard for public comment. Meetings are planned in the first week of April and the first week of June. All flooring manufacturers are encouraged to review the Standard in the public comment period.

- (c) Karine Naud advised that our document should be available for public ballot by about late April (as the months of February & March are totally committed to other Standards)
- (d) At a rough guess, she believes that if no negative votes are cast, then a finalised hard copy of the Standard should be available by May/June 2015.

# AS 1546.3 Domestic Wastewater Treatment

National Precast representative Tony Kruf Central Coast Septics Tony advises since November that he has been to Brisbane twice, to Sydney for two days and has been part of three 6hour teleconferences. A three day meeting is planned in Sydney on 16th, 17th and 18th of February to finalise the draft of the Standard. There has been considerable debate on influent parameters, treatment tank installation and the independent testing of individual systems. Tony will continue representing NP on this Standard.
