National Code update not imminent

NP has been advised that the review of the National Code of Practice by Safe Work Australia is pending Queensland's Office of Industrial Relations' review of the Queensland code (which is similar to the National Code). We were advised at a recent meeting with the Office that the Queensland code review is not likely to occur until mid-late 2017. Accordingly, NP will be making contact with senior staff at Safe Work Australia to call for the urgent review of the Code.
