Everything's bigger in the US!

The size of the precast elements for the Olmstead Locks and Dam project on the Ohio River in the US has to be seen to be believed. Huge 4,260t precast shells that are 30m by 38m and only 0.9m thick are cast on the river bank then carefully lifted and transported via catamaran to their final place in the river. Still under construction, precast manufacture for the project began in 2012. The project won't be completed until 2024!
