# New model Code of Practice for tower cranes published

Safe Work Australia has published a model Code of Practice for tower cranes. It provides practical guidance to PCBUs and other duty holders on managing the work health and safety risks of working with tower cranes. <u>Read more.</u>



### Harmonised chemical labelling: transition completed

Australia has transitioned to the 7th Revised Edition of the Globally Harmonised System of Classification & Labelling of Chemicals (GHS7), which includes changes to hazardous labelling and data sheets. <u>Read more.</u>



### Crane numbers decline by 3.8%

Sydney remains the leading city in terms of crane count in Australia, with 365 cranes out of a total of 836 around the country, while Melbourne cranes have fallen to their lowest levels in a decade. <u>Read more.</u>

A missing split pin from a crane's hoist mechanism led to a large container to fall and kill one worker and injure two others. The crane company was convicted and fined \$400,000. <u>Read more.</u>

A crane company has been charged after it was found to have failed to provide pendant ropes in a serviceable condition and replace pendant ropes that were no longer in a serviceable condition, and failed to maintain a system of work in which pendant ropes were periodically inspected by a competent person, in a 2021 Parkville construction incident. <u>Read more.</u>
